

# NAMIBIAN TRACER STUDY 2019 (NAMTRACE) TRAINING

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## Schedule of Workshop "Data Analysis and Report Writing"

The workshop will take place 01/07-05/07 2019 in Windhoek/Namibia.

### Participants

- Three to five members of the tracer study teams of the participating institutions;
- five persons from the NCHE staff engaged in the tracer studies.

A maximum of 20 participants are expected.

### Required equipment of the participants

All participants should be equipped with

1. a notebook with an installation of the following software:  
NOTEPAD++, TOTAL COMMANDER, WORD, EXCEL, POWERPOINT and SPSS;
2. a printed copy of the graduate survey questionnaire (with visible technical information like variable names);
3. a virus free USB stick;
4. a printed copy the tables report by Gender;
5. the method report of their University;
6. the address database of their tracer study;
7. a paper copy of the last tracer study report "National Graduate Survey 2018".

### Individual preparation

1. SPSS: Participants are required to recall the content of the last two workshops (2015 and 2017) which concentrated on data cleaning and data manipulation with SPSS syntax. If participants did not participate at these workshops it is necessary that they learn the following SPSS commands by themselves:

#### SPSS data documentation of the surveys

- Data list
- Variable labels
- Value labels
- Variable level
- Missing values
- Save file
- Get file

#### Simple and basic data analysis with SPSS syntax

- FREQUENCIES
- DESCRIPTIVES (mean and variance)
- CROSSTABS

#### Data cleaning and data manipulation with SPSS syntax

- RECODE
- COMPUTE
- IF
- COUNT
- TEMPORARY
- SELECT IF
- LIST CASES

**2. Tables Reports:** All participants should choose a table report and examine the report very carefully to make proposals for improvements regarding the statistics, the title and other text elements of the tables. Please check also the footnotes and labels of the variables. Are more explanations necessary? Is other or additional statistical analysis necessary? Are more break variables required to write a meaningful report?

## Objectives

The workshop has three main objectives:

1. Review of the of the data collection phase at every participating institution; *detailed draft written reports are required from every institution and should be distributed in advance*. Latest day of distribution of the reports to NCHE is the 20th June. These method reports will be part of the survey reports. All participating institutions should be enabled to finalise their method report within two weeks after the workshop.

2. Training of key aspects of data analysis. It depends on the demand of the participants to what extent topics like data editing, coding of open answers, procedures to detect data errors, data cleaning, data documentation, data quality, univariate and multivariate procedures of data analysis will be part of the workshop. The participants will be trained to produce ready-to-print tables for their table reports and presentations.

3. Training of the interpretation of the results of the tracer studies and report writing. At the end of the workshop drafts of five chapters of the final report should be ready:

Chapter 1: Methodology of the Tracer Study

Chapter 2: Course of Study, Study Conditions and Study Provisions

Chapter 3: Employment Search for the First Job

Chapter 4: Employment and Work three to five Years After Completion of Study

Chapter 5: Relationship between Study and Work
